# The Rules of Chaos

Chaos is a game of switching partners and gender roles during a dance—but it is deceivingly named. An ideal chaos dance sacrifices none of the flow and connection of a regular contra, adding only an element of surprise to the mix. Chaos functions best on a set of rules that minimize negative impact on other dancers.

- 1. Wait two times through before you start playing. This gives everyone a chance to learn the dance, and lets the caller know the dance is working.
- 2. Only switch with people who are playing. Never confuse beginning dancers.
- 3. Play with your shadows, not your neighbors. The couples ahead of and behind you are going in the same direction as you, so you'll have plenty of opportunities to switch. Switching with your neighbors means that you are going in the opposite direction and you won't see each other again for a long time.
- 4. Don't abandon your partner or your neighbor. When your neighbor expects to swing someone, there should be someone there to swing.
- 5. When there is a problem, hold your ground until it's solved. As the experienced dancers and ones who probably messed it up, it's your job to solve it.
- 6. Don't break connection or the set. For example, a circle is a bad time to switch with someone in another hands four.

Determine who is playing ahead of time. Position yourselves as all ones or all twos, every other couple in the line. Try to inform everyone playing of the boundaries, so that everyone knows who is playing and who isn't. If done right, Chaos dancing results in giggles, double takes, and smiles—not anger and frustration. Experiment and have fun! ~ Written by Laura Gorrin
